Allan Mackintosh will conduct the Maksutov Club session starting at 4:15 P.M.

Telescopes will be judged, in the afternoon for mounting and design -after dark for optical performance. The judging formula for mechanical excellence credits up to 40 points for mechanical stability, up to
15 points for convenience of operation and up to 45 points for ingenuity. Optical excellence is judged for resolution, definition and
contrast collectively; with points from 0 to 100 credited. Percentages
are not used because of the non-uniformity of the exhibits. In both
cases the judges may handicap the telescope, from 0 to 100 points,
for components not made by the exhibitor. Winners are determined by
adding the points credited to each exhibit and dividing the total
by the number of judges reporting on it. This system has proved to
be largely objective; but it improves as more judges volunteer to
serve.

Special certificates are awarded at the discretion of the judges for: exceptional telescopes of specific types, best ladies' telescope, best by a junior under 16 years of age and for other outstanding exhibits.
